

Life Group Questions for the week of December 11, 2011.

How Low Would You Go? | John 1:14

1. The incarnation, God the Son becoming fully human, is a foundational doctrine of the Christian faith. Why do you think the incarnation was necessary? What difference does it make in our day to day lives?
2. John writes about staring intently at His glory, suggesting it took some time to figure it out. If you could get in a time machine and go back and see/watch/observe one single event in the Gospels, which one would it be?
3. We know there is way too much of the “world” in our modern Christmas. It is good to acknowledge all of that, but what’s right with Christmas? What can we do as believers to “redeem” the holiday from all that’s wrong with it?
4. I believe the terms “grace and truth” and “love and truth” are essentially synonymous. Ephesians 4:15 calls on us to speak the truth in love at all times. What happens when these two attributes are not in balance and one is neglected?
5. Read Philippians 2: 1 – 11. Can we experience what the Apostle Paul longs for in verses 2-3 without true humility? How does the example of the incarnation and the crucifixion reveal what true humility is all about?
6. How “low” would you personally be willing to go in order to complete the mission God has for you? How far would you be willing to go to reach people for Christ? Can you truly say that you are “all in”?
